### Recommendations-Summer 2011

#### Recommendation 1

**Subject: Placement of new players with ACBL master points in correct category.**

Every new member who joins the ABA should receive their membership card and a letter welcoming him or her to the American Bridge Association. In this letter, the level of entry will be identified (asterisk, master, life master etc.). This will allow the new player to compete with their peers in the correct category.

**Rationale:**

It is not fair that players who have over 400 ACBL points to compete in the master points races on the asterisk level. You have this information from the membership application. Use it and properly place new players in the correct category.

#### Recommendation 2

**Subject: New Players**

Use Players 0 - 299 instead of New Players. Some of these players have been playing for many years. They are not new but do not have many points. . Price of games for players in this category should be \$2.00 less than regular games at National Tournaments.

**Rationale:** 0- 299 would be a more accurate description of the players.

#### Recommendation 3

**Subject: Executive Board Participation in Election Campaign**

Members of the Executive Board should not openly campaign for a candidate unless they are a candidate.

**Rationale:** This recommendation serves the same purpose as the **Hatch Act** which blocks office holding from using their powers for partisan reasons.

Recommendations 1,2,3 submitted by: Daisy B. Smith, ABA #14185

#### Recommendation 4

Consideration should be given to changing our PRO/AM to a PRO/AM & HAM GAME. A Pro is a player having two thousand or more Master Points; an Am is a player with fewer than six hundred Master Points. A Ham is a player having at least six hundred points but not as many as two thousand Master Points. During the game, Pros will play with Ams and Hams will play with each other. This is done in Chicago and it has worked quite well.

**Rationale:** Players in the 600- 1999 lack the experience to be considered Pros.

#### Recommendation 5

**That the** ABA have a week-long tournament in Atlanta, GA every year. The time of the tournament would be determined by the availability of the chosen hotel. Example: If the Westin Peachtree is the hotel of choice, call the Westin and have them tell you what week in 2010 was their lowest occupancy. Tell them that we can bring in between 400 and 500 people to play during that week. What can you do for us? There will be no meetings, no awards program, no New Players reception, etc. It will be a week of JUST BRIDGE with three sessions a day. This tournament is not designed to REPLACE neither the Spring National nor Summer National, but is an **ADDITONAL** tournament sponsored by the ABA , with nothing extra. The only major expenses would be the staff that works at the tournament. With no
